It is with sadness that we mark the passing of Mel Watkins (May 15, 1932 – April 2, 2020). Mel was a "giant" among Canadian political economists, a savvy political organizer, and by all accounts, a person dear to many for his generosity of spirit and kindness. Mel was a frequent presenter and guest at the annual conferences of the Society of Socialist Studies and a contributor to this Journal. No student of Canadian political economy could consider their education complete without reading and engaging the work of Mel Watkins. Watkins attacked the political orthodoxy that pressed for endless growth derived from finite resources, challenged facile assumptions about resource extraction, and supported Indigenous rights to control and protect precious collective resources. His lifelong commitment to progressive politics did not end with the "Waffle Movement" but continued throughout the course of his life.
